Paul's Life: 2 Timothy 4:6-8

⁶ For I am already being poured out like a drink offering, and the time for **my departure is near**. ⁷ **I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, I have kept the faith.** ⁸ Now there is in store for me the crown of righteousness, which the Lord, the righteous Judge, will award to me on that day—and not only to me, but also to all who have longed for his appearing.

Paul's Examples: 2 Timothy 2:3-7

³ Join with me in suffering, **like a good soldier** of Christ Jesus. ⁴ No one serving as a soldier gets entangled in civilian affairs, but rather tries to please his commanding officer. ⁵ Similarly, anyone who competes **as an athlete** does not receive the victor's crown except by competing according to the rules. ⁶ **The hardworking farmer** should be the first to receive a share of the crops. ⁷ Reflect on what I am saying, for the Lord will give you insight into all this.

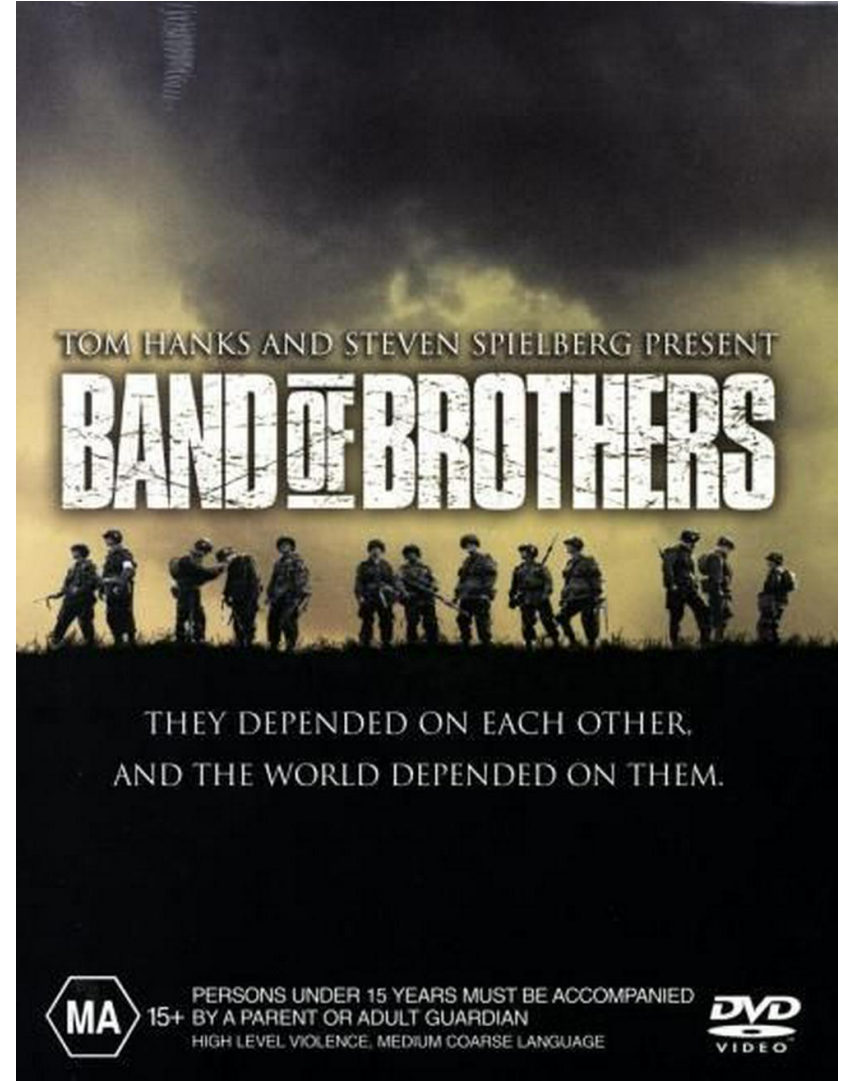
Paul's Example: The Soldier

Focused

Our plans may change, but our objective never does

Objective: To increase in **Joy** in the work and purpose of Jesus

No Entanglements from things that rob us of Jesus' affection



Paul's Example: The Athlete

“Run the race according to the rules”

Integrity – An intentional lifestyle of **Honesty** and **Transparency**.

The temptation to get ahead according to **your rules** vs **God's**



Paul's Example: The Athlete

⁸ Remember Jesus Christ, raised from the dead, descended from David. This is my gospel, ⁹ for which I am suffering even to the point of being chained like a criminal. **But God's word is not chained.**
