II. We need a vision of ourselves (vs. 5-7)

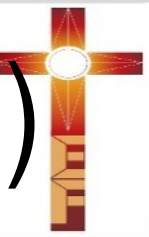
- When Isaiah saw who God really was, he also saw who he really was, and he thought he was done for (vs.5)—“Woe”=damned.
- (Mk.4:38-41; Lk.5:1-8)—The first response of the unholy with the holy God is a traumatic awareness of personal sin.



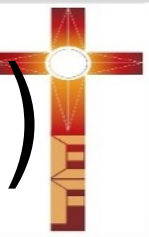
II. We need a vision of ourselves (vs. 5-7)

III. We need a vision of our mission (vs.8-13)

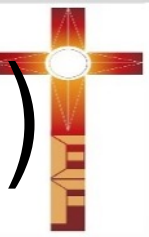


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- God gave him a mission in the world.
