



Those who hate the Master will hate his servants.







Simultaneous bombing and shooting

Two churches attacked, three people injured. Assailants simultaneously attacked two churches in the town of Palu, Central Sulawesi, during church services on Sunday night 12 December, injuring at least three people.

The attacks happened despite government orders for local police to step up security in the weeks leading up to Christmas.


A bomb exploded at Emanuel church in downtown Palu in the early evening at the same time that gunmen opened fire on the congregation of Anugerah church in the south of the city, according to an ABC Radio Australia report.

Sam Kunhyiyop: Western Grad in Nigeria

Sam reports that a Christian man witnessing in a public market was beaten by Muslims, beheaded, and his body dragged through the street.



Julio Ruibal, evangelist, assassinated in Colombia



He refused to let death threats intimidate him. One of 14 pastors killed in Colombia in one year.

Israel denies citizenship to families who are Messianic Jews.



Ricki Kendall and daughter are observant Messianic Jews.

They have been ordered to leave Israel.

Christian bookstore owner murdered!



Rami Ayyad

The owner of Gaza's only Christian bookstore was murdered by Moslems.

This death raised fears among the 3,000 Christians among the 2 million Muslims in the Gaza Strip.

Attacks leave 38 dead on Christmas Weekend

Maiduguri, Nigeria

Dozens of armed men attacked a church, dragging the pastor out of his home and shooting him to death. Two young men rehearsing for a carol service were also slain. About 30 attackers armed with guns and knives killed two people passing by Victory Baptist Church after setting the church and pastor's house ablaze. At least 38 died in Christmas eve attacks across Nigeria.

Be prepared for persecution.




Dear friends, don't be surprised when the fiery trial comes among you to test you as if something unusual is happening to you." (1 Peter 4:12)




